This year's proceeds will again support the Chinook Regional Hospital Redevelopment Project. "When it is complete, residents of Southern Alberta will see a building that will be home to several departments, such as Labour and Delivery, the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and the Heart Function Clinic."

The 2014 Care From the Heart Day and Radio-a-thon was a tremendous success. Over \$210,000 was raised with the support of six local radio stations: Country 95.5, B 93, 107.7 The River, Rock 106, CKVN 98.1 and 94.1 CJOC. Each station broadcast live from the hospital's atrium and reminded listeners of the outstanding care provided by Chinook Regional Hospital. The on-going support of Lethbridge radio stations is unprecedented and hugely important to the success of Care From the Heart Day.

New Equipment Helping Newborns Start Strong

Every woman’s journey to motherhood is different, but one of the first decisions a new mom makes is how to feed her child. When possible, breast feeding is considered the optimal choice for nutrition. This year, the Chinook Regional Hospital Foundation was offered the opportunity to fund 1300 Breast Pump Kits and in doing so, learned of many ways the community is impacted by assisting mothers to provide their newborns with sustenance at the beginning of their life.

“Some babies are born premature or ill and need to stay in the NICU. Providing these babies with their mothers’ breast milk is providing them the most optimal nutritional choice,” says Anna Marshall, Maternal Child Coordinator. “Premature babies have an immature immune system and can be more prone to infections. By providing premature babies with their mothers’ breast milk, it may help “protect” them, because breast milk has unique “germ fighting” factors.”

“Additionally” Anna tells us, “Some women simply need some support in providing their breast milk to their baby. A mother may need assistance in pumping because of engorgement, adopting a baby, breast or chest surgery or trauma, and may be transitioning premature or ill babies to the breast or having difficulties latching.”



The Southern Alberta IBCLC (International Board Certified Lactation Consultants) team works annually with hundreds of families who receive Breast Pump Kits.

Due to the generosity of our donors, monies raised by the CRH Foundation have been used to help families bring the basic needs of life to their newborns, enhance family care in our community and aid in offering solutions for families facing breast feeding challenges based on their unique circumstances.

Helping Moms, Newborns and Their Families Rest Easier

It might be a spouse or a mother, it could be a sister or a best friend. The Chinook Regional Hospital sees approximately 200 babies delivered in an average month (that’s over 2,000 a year!). For some new moms, this visit may be their very first experience in a hospital ever. It can be daunting, to say the least. So, mothers choose their support person and with the help of Mitra Sleep Chairs, this person is able to stay firmly by her side for the duration of her and the baby’s stay.

“The Mitra Sleep Chair allows the mother to have a support person stay with her 24/7,” says Vicki Tougas, Nursing Manager, Maternal-Child & Gynecology. “Having someone who knows her well be with her at all times is incredibly reassuring and comforting. Her support person is able to pull out the chair to make a bed and sleep when they need to without leaving their loved one and their new baby. It also allows them to be active in the care of both mother and baby and promotes bonding between all three.”

Chinook Regional Hospital Redevelopment Project

Funding:
\$128 Million

Highlights:

The Chinook Regional Hospital Redevelopment Project will provide a new 19,000 square metre, multi-story addition to the hospital. About 3,500 square metres of renovations to portions of the existing health centre will also be completed.

The redevelopment project will include:

- an adult outpatient department;
- cardio-respiratory services;
- day procedures;
- day surgery;
- emergency services;
- maternal newborn services including labour and delivery suites, and NICU;
- an inpatient unit (roughed-in space for future development);
- a renal program (roughed-in space for future development); and
- a pre-operative assessment clinic.
